# **Position Overview:**

The **Community Education Researcher** is responsible for research and development of the Wave 2 Standards of Care Modules to be developed by the CATE Community Education Manager.

This position reports to the **Coalition Director.** 

This position is designed to provide a diverse group of individuals with the opportunity to practice in skill set areas such as research into Human Trafficking education and awareness work throughout the US, professional writing and most importantly the opportunity to advocate for systematical change and increase organizational capacity.

This position is remote/hybrid work from anywhere in Missouri. May include travel within your region, and occasional statewide travel as necessary. People who can contribute to CATE's diversity of lived experiences and perspectives are encouraged to apply. The intern will need to have access to Wi-Fi, computer, phone, email and reliable transportation.

# **Organization Overview:**

The Coalition Against Trafficking & Exploitation is a collaborative effort of agencies and individuals building on a community movement to prevent and respond to human trafficking and exploitation through advocacy, public policy, education, and direct outreach strategies. Collectively, these core activities work towards our vision to ensure evidence-based service delivery to survivors and standardized education and awareness to the Missouri region. The CATE coalition believes in a community that is Educated, Aware, and Supportive.

Currently, CATE is housed and operationally and financially supported by Healing Action.

- Can demonstrate work experience with organizing events and facilitating community engagement.
- Can demonstrate professional writing skills and the use of collaborative software and mass communication tools
- Are comfortable with public speaking and frequent communication
- Openly embrace working with all people, regardless of age, gender, race, religious background, immigration status, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, ability, and health status
- Are detail-oriented and highly organized
- Can manage multiple tasks and priorities, set and meet goals and deadlines
- Have a flexible, creative, and proactive working style
- Can pass a background, driving record, and Family Care registry check
- Have a valid driver's license, proof of automobile insurance, and reliable transportation at time of hire and ability to maintain throughout employment
